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# Keiki Korner!



**Wonder Based Art Making**

In this process of making, we are witnessing wonder. The Na Pua Keiki teachers are at the very essence of wondering while they listen and observe the schemas in children's play. In this wonder-based activity, the children are experiencing transformation. They use mortar and pestle to mash and pound chalk pieces. One child excitedly said, "Look, we are making chalk powder!" The next day they took the "chalk powder" and mixed it with white play dough. This was another transformation process as the white dough changed color. Making chalk powder involved crushing, grinding, and pounding. Changing play dough involved kneading, stretching, and shaping. It takes eyehand coordination as well as upper body and hand muscle strength to complete these transformations.

## **Member Program Committee**

The Member Program Committee is tasked with organizing and publicizing events and activities that enrich HIAEYC membership. It sets up an annual calendar of major events, issues the quarterly member newsletter, organizes the annual state conference, and runs the book club. Subcommittees are formed around state-centered activities and events, some of which may be virtual.

### **Public Policy Committee**

The Public Policy Committee centers around state action in Early Childhood. This committee monitors bills presented in the state and federal legislatures, and educates members on bills important to the early childhood profession. It also issues educational material and position papers to state legislators and our federal legislative team to help them make better decisions. This committee may also encourage members, as individuals in the profession, to support or reject proposed legislative initiative.

#### **Elections Committee**

The Nominations and Elections Committee is tasked with promoting a healthy and functioning organization through competent leadership, and encourage diversity and representation among the leadership of the Association. It organizes the process of nominating members in good standing to State Board and County Representative positions from the broad membership of the Association. The committee organizes and runs the election process, ensure all members in good standing have an opportunity vote on Association leadership and issues critical to the Association's mission and vision.

### **Finance Committee**

The Finance Committee oversees all aspects of fund control and management for the Association. It regularly reports to the State Board on the financial status of the Association makes recommendations for change and adjustment. The Finance Committee oversees all Accounts Receivable and Payable, ensuring the flow of cash and other funds are controlled, monitored, and appropriate to the function of the Association.
